### Notes

1. An Art History course can be substituted for Study Abroad.
2. Professional electives must be ITDS, ARCH, IDS, ART, or other approved by the Interior Design Program Chair. At least one of these must be and Art History course.
3. Students must maintain a 2.0 minimum GPA (in all courses) to continue in the program.
4. Students must maintain a 2.5 minimum GPA in ITDS courses to continue in the Interior Design program. If a student's GPA drops below 2.5 in ITDS courses, courses with a grade below 2.5 must be repeated to elevate the GPA to 2.5 before continuing in the degree.
5. This course incorporates the university ViEWS [Visual Expression, Written and Spoken] communication. Consult the Virginia Tech "CLE" guide: <http://www.cle.prov.vt.edu/guides/> for the University Policy on ViEWS. A copy of the specific School proposal is available in the School's administrative offices. The ViEWS communication requirement is met through an array of Theory and History courses, Technology courses, Practicum courses, and Studio courses.
6. Foreign Language Requirement: students who did not complete 2 units of a foreign language in high school must earn 6 credits of a college foreign language, such credits to be in addition to those normally required for graduation. (the high school foreign language courses must be the same language to satisfy the language requirement.)

8. There are no hidden prerequisites if courses are taken in the order shown on the checksheet.
9. We will offer "CLE" Area II credit for this class to ITDS majors. We still recommend taking ARCH 2015,2016 History of Arch.
10. Field study earns 3 credits and can be repeated for a maximum of 6 credits.
